MINUTES of General Meeting Of the Rainier Beach Community Club September 14, 2011

Su Harambe, President, opened the meeting by thanking Richard Moore and the VFW for allowing us the use of the upstairs meeting space. Carol O'Brien read the minutes of the last meeting of July 13, as the August meeting was replaced by a pot luck picnic. The minutes were approved as written. Our guest speaker, Kristin Kinder from Waste Management, explained about a Seattle Neighborhoods Recycling Rewards Program. All neighborhoods will compete for a prize of \$50,000 for neighborhood improvements by being the most improved at recycling and composting over a six month period. We were asked to be our neighborhood's Partner for this contest. We are in the Friday South section of the city. There was lengthy discussion about the pros and cons of taking this partnership on. Contest dates are from Sept. 30, 2011, to March 30, 2012.

Jennifer Pritchard reviewed the list of suggested projects generated through an earlier brainstorming session. There was a vote to decide if we should take on the partnership for the Waste Management contest. The vote was 13 FOR, 0 AGAINST, 8 ABSTAIN. It was decided to delay choosing a project, as we will now focus on the Waste Management contest and put our efforts into winning that contest.

Su announced that we will be having our 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual day after Thanksgiving party and the VFW will be donating the hall. Volunteers will be needed.
