<u>Featured Speaker.</u> - James Le of Seattle's Dept of Transportation spoke on changes made tand planned to Rainier Avenue to improve satefty and flow of buses. Phase 1 addressed corridor from Columbia City to Hillman City – lanes were changed to one NB and one SB, with a center lane for turns. James reported a 15% reduction in crashes. Phase 2 is is process and will essentially do the sames for the corridor from Hillman City to Henderson, which is more challenging since it curves and has non perpendicular intersections which both impact bus trolley overhead lines. James showed how crosswalk visibility will be improved and crosswalk cycling will be reduced from 120 to 90 seconds. He also said that RapidRide would come by 2024.
