<u>Featured Speaker.</u> - Mike Hogan, KC Prosecuting Attorney, reviewed how hate crimes are investigated. He noted that it requires a lot of outreach because it is underreported, especially among immigrants, women and refugees. The 2016 election has really increased such crimes. The typical perpetrator is a drunken 20-somehing white man, 50% of whom have mental issues rather than being a white supremacist. Typical locations include convenience stores, gay bars and beteen drivers. The crime more often takes the form of a threat of violence rather than an act. The good news is that juries are taking a harder view towards hate crimes and not writing it of as a drunken, youthful indiscretion. Also, police are redirecting resources from drug enforcement to hate crimes. When asked what can citizens do about it, Mike suggests that if one witnesses an act or threat or vulgar statement. - REPORT IT.
